漢學研究中心簡介

漢學研究中心成立於民國 70 年,隸屬於教育部,為國家圖書館 兼辦的學術機構,成立初期名稱為「漢學研究資料及服務中心」,自 民國 76 年更為今名。漢學研究中心(以下稱本中心)以聯繫漢學研究 網絡,充實漢學研究資源及推動海內外漢學研究為宗旨。本中心設有 指導委員會,研訂各項研究與發展方針。本中心主任由教育部部長聘 任,例由國家圖書館館長兼任,下設有資料組與聯絡組,推展與執行 各項業務。

任務

一、調查蒐集漢學資料;二、提供參考研究服務;三、報導漢學研究動態;四、編印各種書目索引;五、推動專題研究計畫;六、出版漢學研究論著;七、獎助學人來臺研究;八、舉辦各項學術活動。

服務項目

一、提供漢學研究資源服務

蒐集、整理海內外漢學研究論著,包括西文博士論文、海外供籍複製品、敦煌經卷微捲,以及大陸地區出版之漢學書刊資料,並引進大陸重要學術資料庫。設置閱覽專室,提供各種資料流通服務;開發專題性資料庫,並建置「漢學研究中心資訊網」(http://ccs.ncl.edu.tw/),可自網上查詢全球重要的漢學資訊。二、出版漢學論著及工具書

定期編印《漢學研究》與《漢學研究通訊》。前者係以中國文史 哲研究為主體之國際性學術期刊,供國內外學者發表中英文論著與書 評,本刊曾多次榮獲行政院國科會「獎助國內學術研究優良期刊獎」。

《漢學研究通訊》(季刊)旨在報導國內外漢學研究動態,包括研究成果綜述、重要研究計畫、學術會議、漢學機構等;在國內外設有通訊員,定期提供各研究機構、學校之訊息。上述二刊物皆同時發行紙本與電子版。

自民國 95 年元月起發行《漢學研究通訊電子報》,按月免費以電子郵件寄送訂閱者,強化學界消息之即時性功能。此外,不定期出版漢學相關書目、索引等工具書及論著類叢刊。

三、召開國際學術研討會

為增加國內外學人研究之交流,並提昇國內研究風氣,兼藉會議 共謀資料之蒐集與利用,本中心經常聯合各學術機構主辦國際性研討 會,例如「欲掩彌彰——中國歷史文化中的『私』與『情』」、「數位 時代漢學研究資源」及「空間移動之文化詮釋」等國際學術研討會。 四、外籍學人來臺研究漢學獎助

本中心每年提供研究補助費與來回機票,獎助海外大學相關系所之教授、副教授、助教授、博士候選人,以及研究機構之研究人員,來臺研究漢學;研究期間以三個月至一年為限。期滿須繳交研究報告,由本中心擇優出版。本中心不定期為來臺學人舉辦學術討論會及文化參觀活動。

Center for Chinese Studies

Under the guidance of the Ministry of Education, the Center for Chinese Studies (CCS) was established in 1981 under the name the Resource and Information Center for Chinese Studies. The name was changed in 1987 to its current appellation. The purpose for its establishment was to promote research in Chinese studies, both in Taiwan (the Republic of China) and overseas, and to facilitate communication among scholars and institutions worldwide. CCS is housed in the National Central Library, and the Director of CCS is appointed by the Ministry of Education. Traditionally, the Director-general of the NCL is appointed to simultaneously serve as the Director of CCS. Internally, CCS is comprised of a Materials Division and a Liaison Division, which are responsible for library services, and scholarly services and publications, respectively.

The mission of CCS includes the following: collecting materials related to Chinese studies; providing research and reference services; reporting on academic activities; publishing books, journals, bibliographies, indices, and research series; promoting research projects; providing grants for international scholars to pursue research in Taiwan; and sponsoring academic activities.

Chinese Studies Resources

CCS maintains collections of domestic and foreign works on Chinese studies. These include foreign doctoral dissertations, facsimiles of lost works that can only be found in foreign collections, microfilms of Dunhuang scrolls, and sinological research materials and important scholarly databases from Mainland China. There is also a reading room and a variety of circulation services on-site. Furthermore, the CCS website (http://ccs.ncl.edu.tw) contains a number of special topic databases and online access to important Chinese studies information from around the world.

Research Grant for International Scholars

CCS offers research stipends and travel subsidies to international scholars of Chinese studies who are interested in conducting research in

Taiwan. Professors, associate professors, assistant professors, doctoral candidates, as well as researchers at foreign institutions are eligible for the grant. Grants are available for periods ranging from three months to one year. CCS requires grant recipients to present a research paper at the end of their research tenure and will choose outstanding papers for publication. CCS also, at its discretion, arranges seminars and other cultural activities for visiting scholars.

Publications

CCS publishes a variety of periodicals, bibliographies and monographs, including:

*Chinese Studies

A journal containing articles and book reviews on Chinese literature, history, and philosophy.

*Newsletter for Research in Chinese Studies

A quarterly containing articles, interviews, and regular updates on the happenings in the worldwide community of Chinese studies.

In addition to hardcopy versions, CCS also posts articles from *Chinese Studies* and the *Newsletter for Research in Chinese Studies* online at http://ccs.ncl.edu.tw. Starting in 2006, CCS also began publishing the *E-Newsletter for Research in Chinese Studies* in order to present academic news in a timely fashion. This free publication is sent out to subscribers via email every month. From time to time, reference books and indices are also compiled and published.

International Conferences

Another important role of CCS is to promote interaction and exchange between scholars in Taiwan and overseas. To that end, CCS often sponsors international academic conferences and symposia.

To date, these have included the International Scholarly Conference on "the Private" and "Sentiment" in Chinese History and Culture (2001); the International Conference on Sinological Resources in the Digital Era (2004); and the International Conference on the Cultural Interpretations of Mobility (2008).
